 Continue to Solve Problems with Dollar Bills

Another Look! Kim has \$4 in her bank. She needs \$20 to buy the gift she picked out for her mom. How much more money does Kim need?

$$\$20 - \$4 = \$ \underline{16}$$

Kim needs \$16 more.

Add to check your work.
 $\$4 + \$16 = \$20$
 So, the answer makes sense.

$$\$10 + \$5 + \$1 = \$16$$
